1. Welcome and Introductions

Michelle Brummer, Project Manager, welcomed the Steering Committee to the meeting. She introduced herself and Steve Deasy, a recycling and solid waste planner. She asked the committee members to introduce themselves and share what interests them about community planning. 13 of the 14 Steering Committee members were present, as well as 3 guests.

2. Project Overview

Michelle highlighted the steps of the planning process as shown on the schedule on page 6. She emphasized that Phases II and III will be the major effort. Phase II will focus on the issues the region faces and Phase III, the recommendations to deal with those issues. Two milestone meetings will present the findings of these phases to the public – one in May and one in early fall. A draft plan is scheduled for December 2010.

3. Expectations, Desired Outcomes, and Success Strategies

The following comments reflect the Steering Committee members' introductory perspectives on planning and as well as their expectations for the project.

Joe Lescisko, Planning Commission, Cornwall Borough

- Think regionally. Stop being on an island with decision making.
- Pursue cooperative opportunities where it makes sense, possibly to more effectively save farmland
- Need for a business park to enhance the area and to provide job opportunities. Most leave the
 area to work.

Rob Koehler, Council, Cornwall Borough

- Planning is necessary for projections of future growth and anticipation of planning issues.
- Zoning could enhance economic development and job creation. N. Cornwall does not have industrial uses. We need to need to facilitate development of places where residents can work. Shared zoning.
- Roadmap for streetscape and other joint municipal opportunities to improve road and other services.

Chuck Allwein, Planning Commission, North Lebanon Township

- Review zoning maps and improve consistency across zoning classifications.
- Cooperation with other municipalities.
- Transparency to the public as the plan is developed.

Dawn Hawkins

- Need to plan, formally or informally, to accomplish your goals.
- Balanced land use.

Cheri Grumbine, Manager, North Lebanon Township

- North Lebanon Township has been active in planning.
- Anticipate "hot spots" and plan for vacant areas

- An opportunity to get to know what's going on in other municipalities (e.g. land use & traffic)
- Look for consistent, common ordinances, e.g. airport hazard, and uniform advice from experts.
- Move beyond barriers to intermunicipal agreements.
- A local government mission to characterize township focus for residents and businesses.
- Consider a regional recreation program, like Northern Lebanon County region, or at least look at opportunities to connect trails.

Sheila Wartluft (assistant Township Manager), North Lebanon Township

• Utilize existing planning docs and tools. Avoid reinventing the wheel. The product should be a "working document" and valuable reference for decision-making.

Earl Roberts (resident), North Lebanon Township

- Consistency in zoning and administration.
- Plan for both land uses and needed infrastructure.
- Combined allocation of resources/sharing with cost-benefits including service consistency (e.g. payroll & benefits across law enforcement attract/retain skilled personnel who like stability).

Bob Gearhart, North Cornwall Township

- Need for organized growth through reasonable (not too restrictive) regulations.
- Demonstrate interconnectedness of municipalities.
- Roadmap for joint projects.

Robin Getz, Manager, North Cornwall Township

- Anticipate future trends to benefit us as municipalities and the school district.
- Smart planning and transportation alternatives for residents and for businesses.
- Foster intermunicipal cooperation to interconnect amenities and services and reach sustainable service levels.

Jon Beers, Planning Commission, South Lebanon Township

- We need to prepare for growth that will come when the economy recovers.
- Will the City be involved?
- Ideas and direction for more walking trails like the once that connects Evergreen Estates to S. Hills Park.
- Explore mixed use developments of residential and light commercial that would reduce traffic, provide services and eateries close to home, etc. Possibly through a zoning overlay. There are some of these developments in Lancaster County, e.g. just off the Fruitville Pike.

Curtis Kulp, Manager, South Lebanon Township

- Wants to assure that residential needs are met through planning.
- Balance the region's land use pattern. South Lebanon Township has industrial land, others have commercial.

Frank Dombrowski, Supervisor, West Cornwall Township

- Balance development and open space
- Assure we understand and meet mandates.
- Protect both township and residents interests.

Jeff Steckbeck, Municipal Engineer, Cornwall Borough and West Cornwall Township

- Balance the common good with private property rights.
- Abide by zoning

Bob Sentz and Julie Cheney, Lebanon County Planning Department

- This regional plan is an outgrowth of the county plan.
- Planning across borders is efficient and attractive to funding sources.

5. Use of Lebanon County Comp Plan and Mapping

Michelle asked how the Steering Committee felt about use of information in the Lebanon County Comprehensive Plan. She indicated that some data has not changed, e.g. descriptions and locations of natural resources, and that mapping from the county plan could be "zoomed" into the Cornwall-Lebanon region and updated as needed, e.g. land use, agricultural easements.

Cheri Grumbine said that use of information that is still current, e.g. natural resources, would be fine. Curt Kulp said that mapping should indeed focus on the region with a small buffer into adjacent municipalities, e.g. to show land use patterns and their compatibility/conflict with uses in the Cornwall-Lebanon region.

6. Next Meeting: February 28 Regional Field Tour

The next meeting will be a field tour of the region. We will departing from the South Lebanon Township at 9am on February 28 at 9am. We will return between noon to 1pm (estimated). Robin will submit a Lebanon Transit bus request for 28 persons.
